

This is a guide on how to live more fully, and more purposefully, as an Evangelical Christian. There are five reasons to live, with none taking precedent over the rest.1- To please the Lord. Anything that pleases Him is a form of worship. Being mindful of Him, acting with thoughts towards Him, no matter how mundane the action, is a form of worship.2- To be a member of a faith community. Smaller groups are particularly favoured.3- To emulate Jesus and adhere to the tenets of the bible, to learn the bible, and to resist the temptations of Satan.4- To serve. Everyone has their own set of skills that are to be brought to service of the ministry. Much of the book goes into what it means to serve.5- To minister to unbelievers. This is also covered in detail in this book. The original work contains substantial additional video and audio content making this a convenient digest for refresher

or reference. I received a copy in exchange for an honest review.

As a Christian, this review of "The Purpose Driven Life" resonated with me. It is a guide to spiritual development according to evangelical Christian values and teachings, and draws upon the Bible to make its argument. This review of an obviously religious book was well-done, describing the book's points and themes without getting too preachy (though honestly, I wouldn't have minded a little preaching). The guide is structured to be a 42-day guide with video material, Bible-study audio, and an online community. This Eureka review was able to outline the program into 10 key takeaways that were meaningful, insightful, and motivational. I loved this review and recommend it to anyone in need of religious inspiration. I was given a copy of this book to review.

As a big fan of Eureka summaries, I have to admit to being disappointed with this one. I will tell you that I have not read the original 481 page book by Rick Warren but some of what is written in this summary does not sound right to me i.e. interpreted incorrectly. In some cases it's almost like the Eureka author is talking/writing to a child, like I was being talked down to, patronized.Maybe what I have written above has piqued your curiosity? In that case, read on for a little detail on this 22 page summary about what is undeniably a VERY popular book. Important to note that "the new edition of the original is supplemented with video material, Bible study audio and online community access". If you don't know who Rick Warren is, he is the founder of the megachurch Saddleback Church. There are 10 Key Takeways.
